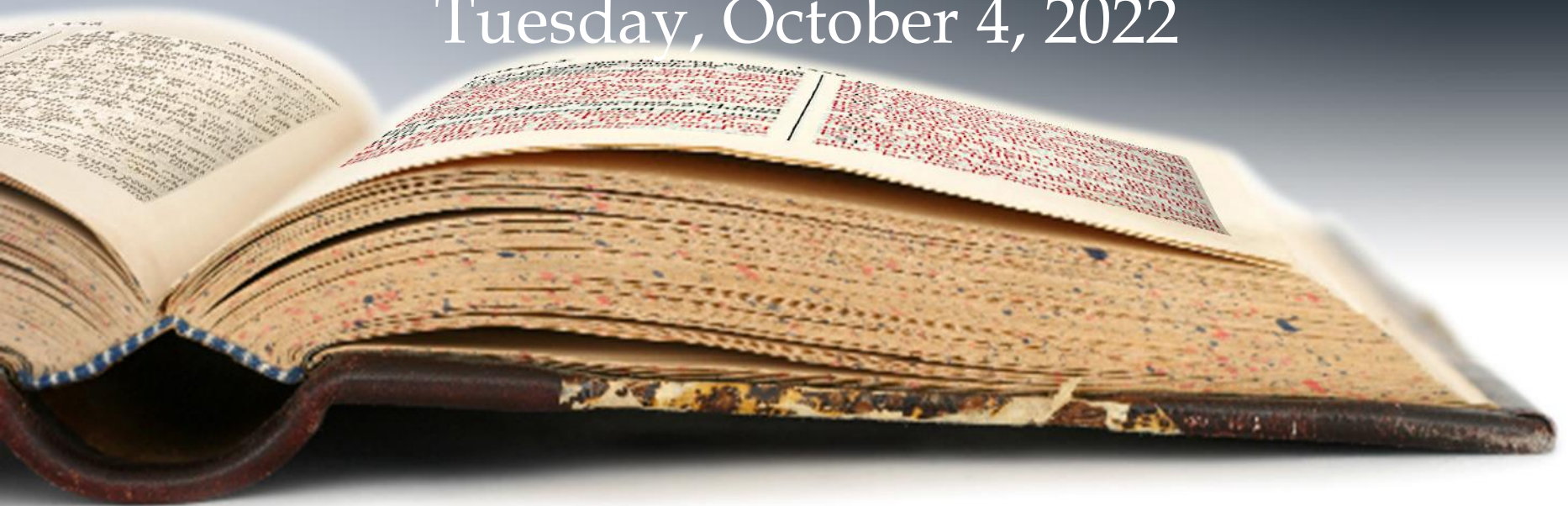

Let there be consistency . . .

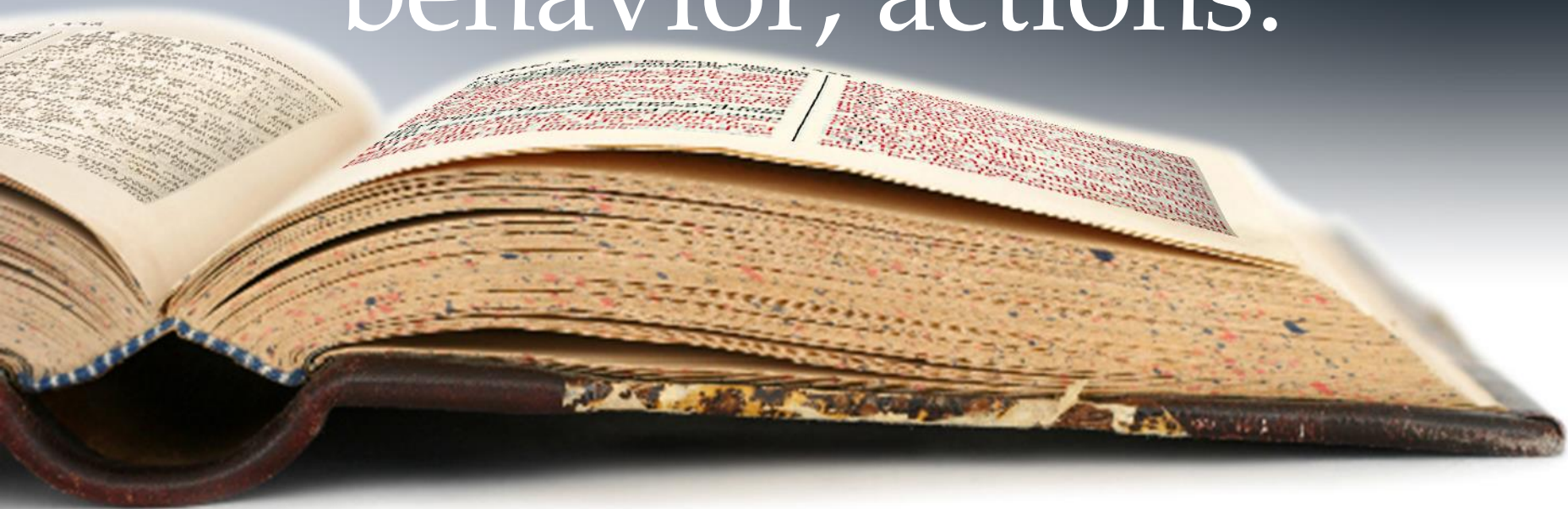




The word “consistent” is defined as constantly adhering to the same principles, course, form, etc.



It is essentially  
“steadfast” adherence to  
the same principles,  
behavior, actions.



The word “consistent” or “consistently” does not appear in the Bible, but synonyms for it do, such as steadfast, resolute, unwavering, changeless, constant, dependable, never failing, reliable, single minded, devotion, firm, wholehearted.

As believers, we are to live lives consistent with who we are in him and the profession of our faith.



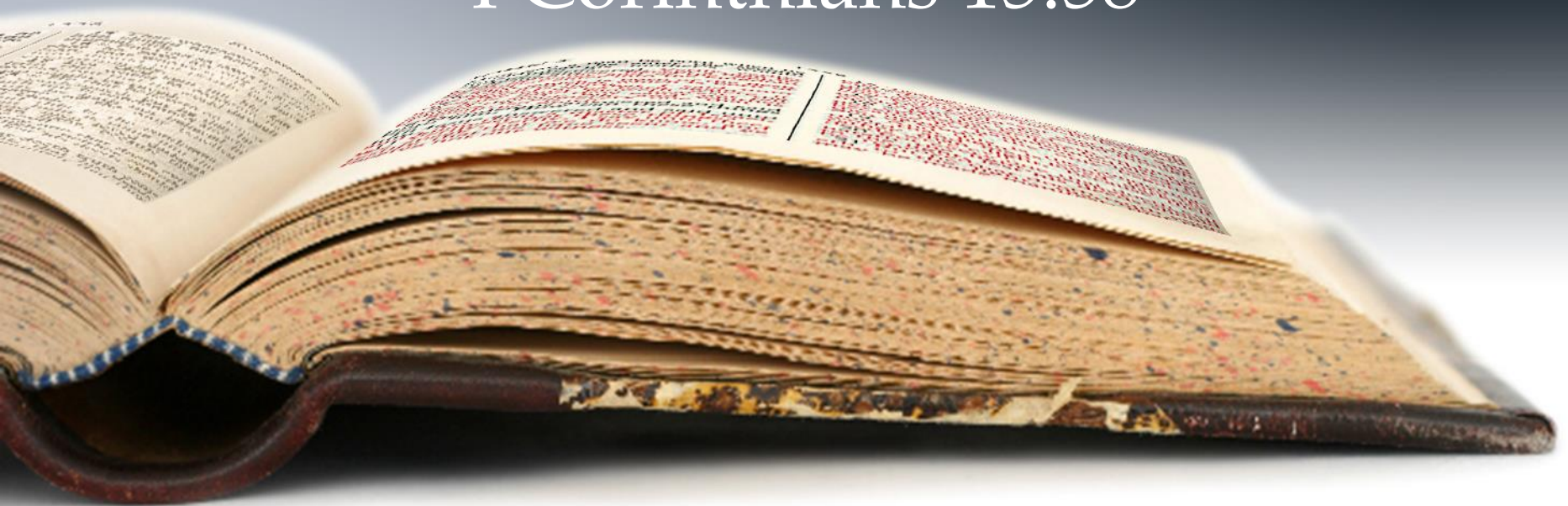
## Discussion or Personal Reflection:

Discipline means giving up the good and the better for the best.



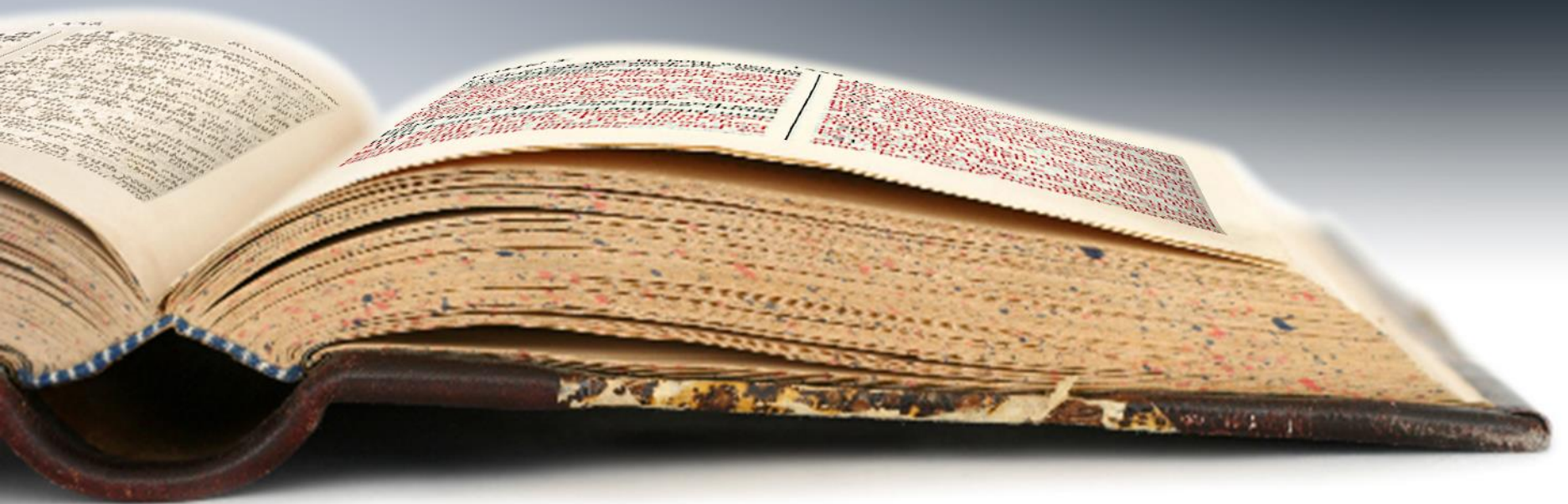
Lastly, in order to be consistent,

in spite of opposition.





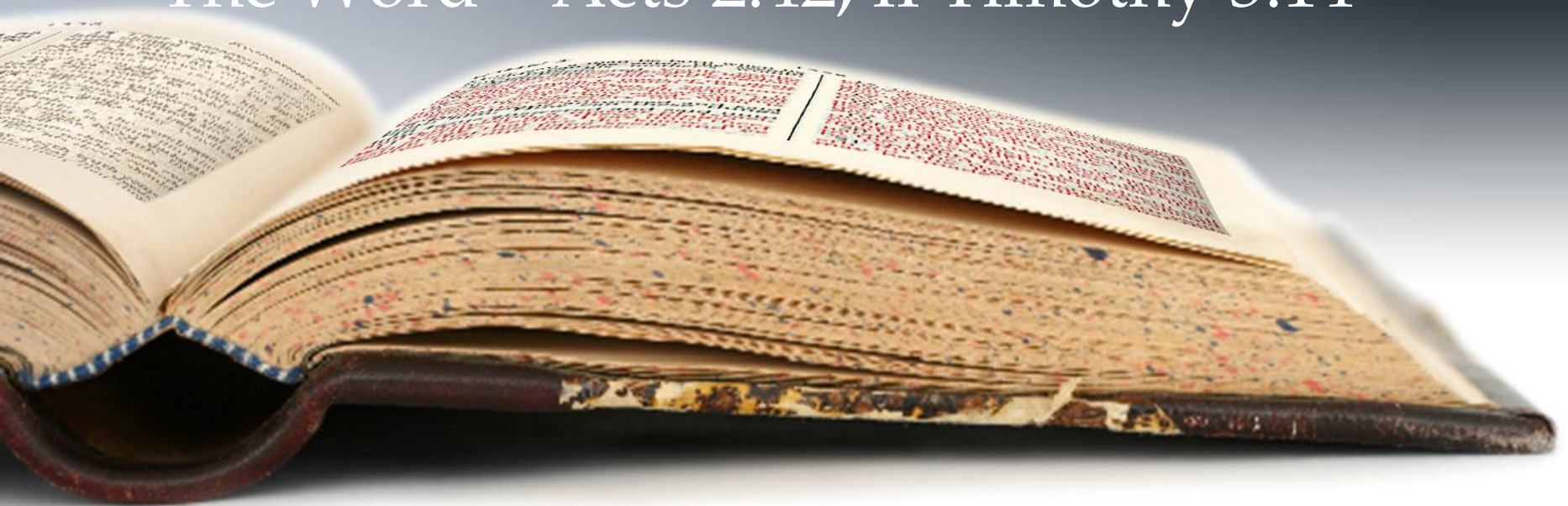
