Ephesians 6:10-18, Cont'd

**14** Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, **15** and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. **16** In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. **17** Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

# The Story of Daniel

Daniel in the Den of Lions.

It started with favor. Daniel was favored by King Darius.

Daniel was an administrator in charge of a certain area in Babylon.

He had satraps that worked for him to help govern.

His associates and colleagues became jealous of Daniel's ability and conspired to defeat him.

# The Story of Daniel

Daniel's colleagues convinced King Darius not to allow any prayer for 30 days.

This plan was an indirect attack at Daniel who prayed to God faithfully every day.

When Daniel began praying he was taken into custody and thrown in the den of lions.

# The Story of Daniel

The lion in Daniel's story represents might and power. The lion was meant by the enemy to destroy Daniel. But because Daniel was faithful to God, the lion had no power over Daniel. God shut the mouths of the lions and ensured that he would not be harmed.

Three people in Scripture defeated lions: David, Samson, and Benaiah.
